Fight for What's Right

"As spoken by Poe Dameron in *Star Wars: Episode IX – The Rise of Skywalker*, 'We're not alone. Good people will fight if we lead them.'

I have seen this truth play out over the course of my career. Many years ago, my superintendent asked me to assist two impassioned businessmen from the community, self-appointed founders of an 'Alternative Energy Committee' seeking information regarding energy usage in the town and public schools. They were interested in building a wind turbine—the first of its kind in our coastal Massachusetts community.

I prepared a simple spreadsheet of projected expenses, construction costs, and utility rebates over 10 years, revealing that such a project could pay for itself over five years and return energy credits to the town every year going forward.

A favorable newspaper article about the project encouraged local citizens—and experts—to attend committee meetings. Part of the project's momentum but not a technical expert, I served the committee as its recording secretary.

Today, there are thousands of educators and local citizens serving on committees to protect our environment and halt global warming. Good people will fight if we lead and support them."
